### **RANDY ROMANSKI**

Secretary | Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP)

Randy Romanski was announced secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection by Governor Tony Evers in June 2020 and was confirmed by the Senate on September 28, 2021.

Prior to this appointment, Romanski served as DATCP deputy secretary since January 2019 and interim secretary since November 2019. He brings decades of experience in government administration and policy development to the department.

### **CORY GEIGER**

International Dairy Economist and Journalist

A graduate of the University of Wisconsin–Madison with degrees in ag economics and dairy science, Geiger has been a member of the Hoard's Dairyman editorial team since 1995 where he has been the lead editor for over a decade. In 2018, Geiger spearheaded the effort that brought Hoard's Dairyman China to the marketplace joining its English, Japanese and Spanish editions.

Geiger's award-winning book, On a Wisconsin Family Farm, Historic Tales of Character, Community, and Culture, was named a finalist in the 2022 National Indie Excellence Awards Competition. The book is in its third press run.

Corey was elected the 65th President of Holstein Association USA and served a combined 11 years on the board of directors and a three-year term on the Council on Dairy Cattle Breeding. He also serves on the board of directors for World Dairy Expowhere he chairs the Education Committee. Geiger served as fundraising co-chair of the Farm Wisconsin Discovery Center, a \$13.5 million educational facility dubbed "the Fair Oaks of Wisconsin". Corey hosts the DairyLivestream webcast and has spoken in Canada, China, Mexico, the United Arab Emirates, Singapore, and 22 U.S. states.

### KRYSTA HARDEN

Chief Executive Officer | U.S. Dairy Export Council Krysta Harden served as Executive Vice President of Global Environmental Strategy for Dairy Management Inc. (DMI), which manages the national dairy checkoff on behalf of nearly 37,000 U.S. dairy farmers. In May of 2020, Krysta was named Chief Operating Officer of the U.S. Dairy Export Council.

Leveraging a strong background within agriculture, sustainability and food policy, Harden plays a key leadership role in defining the vision, strategy and plan forward for U.S. dairy's environmental commitment. Collaborating with dairy farmers and leadership within the dairy community through the Innovation Center for U.S Dairy, Harden will continue to identify the science, best practices and metrics that will further advance the positive impact U.S. dairy has on the environment and the important role it plays in a sustainable food system. She also provides executive leadership on the Innovation Center's Environmental Stewardship Committee.

### **TORSTEN HEMME**

President | International Farm Comparison Network Dr. Torsten Hemme is the founder and CEO of the International Farm Comparison Network (IFCN). He studied agricultural economics at the University of Göttingen in Germany and at Texas A&M University in the USA. His doctoral thesis set the basis for the IFCN, whose mission is to create a better understanding of the dairy world by providing comparable data, knowledge, and inspiration.

In 2022, researchers from more than 100 countries participated. Moreover, more than 140 agribusiness companies are members of the network and use its data and knowledge base for their strategic planning.

### SHERYL MESHKE

Co-President, CEO | Associated Milk Producers Inc.

Appointed in 2014, the position caps more than three decades with the company. She holds the distinction of being the first woman to be named CEO of a U.S. dairy cooperative. The AMPI Board of Directors has announced she will become the co-op's sole CEO effective Jan. 1, 2023.

Meshke currently serves on the boards of the Innovation Center for U.S. Dairy, the National Milk Producers Federation, the U.S. Dairy Export Council and the Minnesota AgriGrowth Council. She is past chairman of the Minnesota Dairy Research, Teaching and Consumer Education Authority, The Cooperative Foundation, Cooperative Communicators Association and the Minnesota FFA Foundation. Meshke holds a bachelor's degree in agriculture from South Dakota State University and a master's degree in business from the University of St. Thomas. She is a fifth generation farmer, operating a hog and sheep farm near Lake Crystal, Minn.




### **AD VAN VELDE**



From July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021, the IABC assisted more than 150 companies that represent over 95 towns and cities in Wisconsin.


